Air Canada - In 1994 Air Canada adopted a policy to stop carrying research primates. In 1996 the Barbados Prime Research Foundation filed a complaint to the Canadian Transportation Agency (CTA) and in January 1998 the CTA declared that Air Canada was not entitled to refuse to carry primates or any animal for motives based on their intended use by the consignee. Therefore since January 1998 Air Canada has complied with this ruling.

Air China - Air China's UK office has stopped transporting primates, however Air China (Beijing) continues to carry primates destined for research.

Air Mauritius - has stopped transporting primates into the UK only.

Continental - adopted a policy to ban primates on their international (not domestic) flights

Lufthansa - legal requirements imposed by the German government mean that Lufthansa is obliged to continue carrying primates for the German research industry. However, the transportation of all non-domestic primates has been banned.

US Airways - In 1993 US Airways placed an embargo on the transportation of any lab animal shipment to its Frankfurt, London & Paris locations only.
